Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting, L.I.F.E. Inc.
Held at Center Village 04/24/2019

The meeting was called to order by President Maney at 7:02pm. The first order of business was to approve the minutes of the December 19th 2018 meeting. Ron Grasso made a motion which was seconded by Bruce Siegel and the board voted 5-0 to approve the minutes. The meeting was then opened up to residents for general comment. Frank Anderson from Essex Village stated that there were no concerns at this time at Essex Village. Bob Sarcia echoed Frank's sentiment for Colonial Village. Steve DiCato from Center Village stated that the screen door to the rear of his building needed attention. Several other Center Village residents also voiced similar concerns about doors in their building. The Board requested that they all be checked. Gloria Fallon stated that she was of the understanding that some of the trash sheds were being repaired and that in her opinion they all should be addressed. (This is part of a multi-year project, any sheds being done at this time were not done last Fall), the Board advised they should all be checked. Ellen Lederman complained that a shrub beside her unit was dying and that the lawn area behind her building was in poor shape. The Board requested that this situation be checked. Mrs. Generazzo stated that she thought the bark mulch was piled up too high around the trees at Essex Village and speculated that it may be the reason some of the trees are declining. Mr. Sarcia expressed the opinion that if true, it may not be a good practice and it should be checked. The Board directed that the situation be checked and resolved. Hearing no other comments from the residents a motion was made and seconded to adjourn at 7:11pm. The Board voted 5-0 to adjourn the meeting.
The Board went into a brief executive session at 7:15pm.
