

Based on information from the U.S. Forest Service, these street trees are less susceptible to climate change in this century and commonly available in the nursery trade.

Native (Eastern United States) trees recommended for street tree use

Acer rubrum - Red Maple
Cladrastis kentukea - Yellowwood
Gleditsia tricanthos - Honey Locust
Gymnocladus dioicus - Kentucky Coffeetree
Liquidambar styraciflua - Sweetgum
Liriodendron tulipifera - Tulip Tree
Nyssa sylvatica - Black Gum / Tupelo
Platanus occidentalis - American Sycamore
Quercus bicolor - Swamp White Oak
Quercus coccinea - Scarlet Oak
Ulmus americana - Elm (hybrids only)

Non-Native trees recommended for street tree use

Acer buergerianum - Trident Maple
Acer campestre - Hedge Maple
Ginkgo biloba - Ginkgo
Koelreuteria paniculata - Golden Raintree
Parrotia persica - Persian Parrotia
Prunus serrulata - Kwansan Cherry
Zelkova serrata - Japanese Zelkova
